The shortest day of the year is the light at the end of the tunnel for many construction workers who have been working in the wet, cold and dark afternoons and evenings for what feels like an age at this point. We know it's likely to get colder, but the lighter evenings make a big difference to us all. The darkness hasn't stopped us however, as progress continues and the in-situ stair cores in the new school building are increasing in height.

Concrete loads for stair cores

This section of the works feels painstakingly slow as each crane lift adds another shutter to provide the mould for the outline of the stair cores. The concrete walls are reinforced with steel before the concrete is poured and each concrete pour is specifically timed to ensure the concrete cures at a rate which means it can bond successfully with the next pour. The smallest of issues can cause big problems for the scheme at this stage, like a concrete wagon getting stuck in a traffic jam...

Fact of the month: Since we're talking stair cores, let's talk stairs: The Guinness Book of World records recognises the longest staircase can be found on the Niesen Mountain in Switzerland with a whopping 11.674 steps. Thankfully there aren't quite that many at Burlington...!
