It's been a little while since our last update so we've lots to show and tell vou.

Spring is here and speaking of springs, there's the small matter of the steel frame that feels like it's sprung-up out of nowhere! The main body of the building's frame is installed with only the roof and sports hall area remaining. Within a matter of weeks, the presence of the impressive frame allows you to truly gauge the size and epic nature of this development. This really will be a very special space to learn!

Coming up this month

Notable deliveries/collections/ noisy works:

- Steel frame deliveries
- Precast concrete plank deliveries
- Scaffold erection
- De-watering of the attenuation tank area

You may have also noticed (if you can see us from above the hoarding) that we have also started to install the precast concrete slabs. These lay from steel to steel and quickly form the floors. Just above these slabs, we'll pour a concrete topping with a re-bar mesh so it forms a clear, strong surface ready for screed, underfloor heating and flooring (like vinyl or carpet) much later in the build process.

Fact of the month: Let's talk steel. An awesome material that proves to be 1,000 times stronger than iron, relatively lightweight and more elastic than rubber. Better yet, it is one of the world's most recycled materials so we're particularly delighted to be using it to form the huge frame of your new school!
