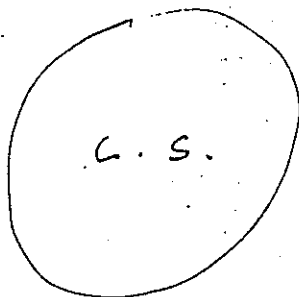
(CONTROL OF ADVERTISEMENTS) AREA OF SPECIAL CONTROL ORDER, 1972

The Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames as local planning authority in exercise of the powers contained in Regulation 26 of the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 1969 hereby make the following Order :

1. All the land within the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames ^{COLOURED GREEN AND HATCHED BLACK} which is shown ~~hatched green~~ on the Map annexed to this Order is hereby defined as an area of special control for the purposes of the said Regulations. ~~In case of any discrepancy between the map and Order, the map shall prevail.~~
2. This Order may be cited as the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames (Control of Advertisements) Area of Special Control Order, 1972.

3. TOWN & COUNTRY PLANNING (CONTROL OF ADVERTISEMENTS) REGULATIONS, 1969
HOOK AND CHESSINGTON AREA OF SPECIAL CONTROL ORDER, 1972 (CP 5.2.1)

To note that the Control of Advertisements (Area of Special Control) Order 1972, relating to an area of land covering part of the Metropolitan Green Belt within the Royal Borough largely comprising Hook and Chessington, has been confirmed by the Secretary of State for the Environment and the Order came into force on the 30th June, 1977. The effect of the Order is to impose an absolute ban on advertisements within the area with certain exceptions, e.g. election notices, statutory notices.

Consent may be granted by the Council to display a small range of other types, e.g. for travelling fairs, a local event, public safety, or within a specified size or type.

Advertisements displayed in an Area of Special Control may, in certain circumstances, be required to be removed without further notice within two months after expiration of a specified period.
